Mary's Story - Bible Story

Leader: Today we have with us a very special guest, the angel Gabriel. Sometimes people call Gabriel the Christmas angel because Gabriel announced the birth of Jesus. Gabriel will share with us that amazing event.

Gabriel: Thank you for asking me to share with you the most important message I have delivered. I am Gabriel, an archangel—one of the chief messengers for God. My name means "God is great" and "God is my strength." On several occasions I appeared to humans to give them messages from God. I spoke to Daniel and explained his vision to him. I also appeared to Zechariah in the temple to announce the birth of his son John. But I want to tell you about the time I spoke to Mary and announced the birth of the Messiah.

God sent me to Galilee to speak to a young woman named Mary. She was a faithful follower of God, and at that time, she was betrothed to Joseph, who was a righteous man. I announced my appearance by telling Mary, "Rejoice, favored one! The Lord is with you!"

Mary was startled when I first appeared to her. That was the normal reaction I got when I appeared to human beings. So, I said to Mary,

"Don't be afraid. God is honoring you." That was great praise coming from God.

I continued with my message, "Look! You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and he will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of David his father. He will rule over Jacob's house forever, and there will be no end to his kingdom."

I don't think Mary was afraid of me or of my message, but she was definitely confused. She asked me, "How can I have a baby since!'m not married yet?" My message was very hard to understand because there had never been a birth of a child like this one.

I explained to Mary, "The Holy Spirit will come over you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the one who is to be born will be holy. He will be called God's Son. Look, even in her old age, your relative Elizabeth has conceived a son. This woman who was labeled 'unable to conceive' is now six months pregnant. Nothing is impossible for God."

Mary humbly accepted my explanation and told me, "I am the Lord's servant. Let it be with me just as you have said." Then I left her.

Mary knew the Scriptures and she knew about the coming Messiah. She didn't ask for or seek this role in God's plans. God simply stepped into her life and brought her into God's service. She was honored for her faithfulness and openness to serve God. Mary knew the birth of this child would not be easy for her. The journey before her would have many problems, but she believed God, and she chose to serve God.


Look carefully at your picture of Mary and the angel Gabriel. Find 3 hidden items in the picture and circle them.


1d Grid Code - Puzzle (Older Elementary)

Pretzels

Cheerios®

Oyster crackers

White icing



Directions

- Stand your Bugle up on the open end of the cone.
- Use white icing at the top of the cone to attach an oyster cracker for the face. Use the white icing to draw eyes and a mouth on it.
- Use white icing on the top of the oyster cracker to attach a Cheerio for the halo.
- Take a twisted knot pretzel and break off the bottom piece between the two knots. Break it
 into two pieces and place them together with icing to form the angel's praying hands. Position
 them in the front of the cone just under the oyster cracker.
- Use the rest of the twisted knot pretzel to make the wings. Attach it to the back of the cone
 using the icing.
- Make several angels for your snack.
